Competitions and festivals are back to a full calendar now taking place in person. Virtual competitions continue also. Consumables	Wear and tear of regularly used sports kit and equipment.	£500	This year, we provided catch up swimming lessons for children in year 5 and 6 who are not yet able to swim 25m. All year 6 children who participated in the catch up swimming met the success criteria of 25m unaided. All year 4 children have completed swimming lessons in the summer term. 85% of the cohort were able to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres. 85% of the current Year4 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke. In addition to learning strokes, pupils also learnt safe self-rescue in different water based situations with an 85% success rate. All of the pupil who did not meet the success criteria for Year 4 swimming will attend catch up swimming in Year 5 during 23 – 24. Yes Impact of Dedicated Coach £17075 - Continuing to have a qualified teacher as our sports coach is having an ongoing impact on participation rates in sporting activities. Furthermore, the coach works alongside teachers in PE lessons providing exceptional levels of CPD. As a result of having an experienced teacher in PE lessons, all staff have developed significant subject knowledge and benefit from team teaching, modelled lessons and feedback.
