WHAT'S ON THIS HALF TERM - Once Upon A Time

Throughout this theme we will be reading lots of traditional stories such as The Three Little Pigs, Goldilocks and the Three Bears, Jack and the Beanstalk and The Little Ted Hen(among others). The children will be learning about how a story has a beginning, middle and end and we will be thinking about good and bad characters. We will be working in a team to try and build a strong house for the Three Little Pigs - before the wolf comes along to try and blow them down.

We will look at how illustrations have changed over time, comparing illustrations from these stories printed in the past to newer version of these stories. We will also be making our own bread rolls (just like the Little Red Hen).

We will be talking throughout this theme about our own favourite story books and would love the children to be able to talk about their favourite book - please could you email us or upload to Tapestry a picture of them holding/reading their favourite book - we will try and include some of these in our story sharing sessions.



LITERACY

MATHS



In **phonics** we will continue to revise the single letter sounds before moving on to digraphs (two letters that make one sound). Children will be decoding and reading words and simple sentences.

In **Drawing Club** children will be encouraged to use known phonic sounds to beginning to write CVC words words and simple phrases as part of their magic codes.

In maths we will be revising numbers 4 and 5 before starting to explore numbers 6, 7 and 8 - looking at the composition of each of these numbers. We will also be learning how to use balance scales and exploring the capacity of different containers.

Our welly walk this half term will: Be following a map of the local area which will lead us to clues about each story character (a little like a simple orienteering exercise)

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD AT HOME

Reading - we ask that children read at least 4x per week and that this is recorded in their reading challenge. Reading challenges are expected to be in school every day.

High frequency words - We really appreciate your support in helping your child to learn their coloured high frequency words. They will be tested each week when they read with their teacher in school. There are 9 sets of words to learn across the year. We will test your child on these words weekly in school. By half term we would like your child to have completed the fourth set of words (green) and be learning the fifth set (blue).

Maths - Encourage your child to subitise (instantly recognise) quantities 1-5 without counting - this great game from White Rose Maths is fun to play (scan the QR code)
