What's on this half term?

History

Children will be discovering how our village has changed over time and will be going on a walk around the village to spot historic buildings and see how the village has developed through the years.

Art

Children will be exploring printing techniques and creating their own Gyotaku-inspired Japanese fish prints, learning how artists use texture to make sea creatures come to life.



Science

Children will be learning about different materials and their properties, exploring how their suitability and purpose help us choose the right material for everyday objects

Spellings - We really appreciate your support in helping your child to learn their weekly spellings. They will be tested each Friday.

Numbots - Regular practise helps with many areas of the Key Stage One maths curriculum.
